Horticulture 200/300 (Greenhouse and Nursery Externship) – Spring 2020

Course Description: Unpaid field experience in commercial greenhouse management.

<u>Professional Work Site and Supervisor</u>: Sunland Nursery, Inc., Color Division, 1426 Burke Road, Las Cruces, NM 88007; Mr. Don Williams (Production Manager).

Course Number per Class Standing: HORT 200 (FR-SO; 3 cr.); HORT 300 (JR-SR; 3 cr.).

<u>Course Objectives</u>: 1) **Allow** students to receive training in various aspects of commercial nursery management that cannot be provided in the formal curriculum, thereby increasing both the student's academic experience and job competitiveness, 2) **Enable** students to work in a "real world" production setting and think critically while completing tasks, 3) **Provide** employers with student support in their management tasks, and 4) **Aid** employers in employee recruitment efforts.

Textbook: None.

<u>Meeting Times and Days</u>: Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 1 to 4 pm. A total of nine working hours per week on site are required. Typically, a week will consist of the students initially receiving training in specific subjects followed by students' completion of designated tasks and assignments.

<u>Transportation</u>: Students should have their own transportation. However, if a student does not have their own transportation, they may travel with another student who has transportation and share in the transportation costs with that driver.

<u>Communication</u>: NMSU email will be used as necessary for any off-site communication between instructor, commercial managers, and students. Students are expected to maintain periodic watch of their NMSU email so as not to miss important correspondence for this and other courses.

<u>Attendance</u>: Daily attendance will be monitored by the managers. Students are expected to report to work promptly for all meetings and treat the experience as a real job. If a student expects to miss work due to illness or emergency, they must telephone the manager ahead of time to report the absence.

<u>Grading</u>: The manager and instructor will evaluate the semester-long work record of the student to determine the student's final grade. Attendance and completion of designated tasks and assignments are the main grading criteria. A lunchtime meeting during final exam week (date TBD) will allow all participants to provide comments about their externship experience; lunch will be provided by PES.
